1) **Title of the Practice:** Societal Commitment

Goals: To help the less advantageous section of the society and farmers.

Context: Commitment to societies in general and commitment to the neighbouring farmers in particular is an attempt to bring about a socio-economic transformation of the community structure through the efforts of our college. The main concept is on raising the standard of living of the citizens and in reconstructing the society.

2) **Title of the practice:** Co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

Goal: To improve the overall personality development,
To develop the communication skills;

To make aware the students for social & human relations.

Context: Curricular activities are those activities that are undertaken along with academic studies. Cocurricular activities are carried out outside the normal classroom.
